PREPARING FOR YOUR FISHING SEASON

February and Fishing. For the Great Lakes Salmon fisherman, the only thing that these two have in common is that they both start with the letter F. However, February is the perfect month to get organized for the up coming Big Lakes trolling season.

While sorting through tackle, it is important to take inventory and make note of things that need to be replaced or replenished. Make sure you have plenty of what you want or need, that way when you are wandering around the fishing shows and decide to make a purchase, you can honestly justify the purchase to yourself or your spouse, if that it is necessary.

While taking inventory and organizing the tackle, take the extra time to inspect swivels, split rings, sharpen hooks on baits and replace them as necessary. Inspect guides on rods, line on reels and drags. If your reels require professional attention, this is the time that you should take them to the shop. Most reel repair shops can get you in and out quickly this time of the year so one is not scrambling come April.

With your tackle inspected, replenished and organized, turn your attention to organizing your boat. Make a list of all the safety items that need to be checked, such as fire

extinguishers, flares, life jackets etc. These items should be recharged or replaced as directed. If you have access to your boat, the inventory of these items can be accomplished; if not at least you will be ready when the weather breaks. Safety items are the most often overlooked when preparing for the big water season, but there definitely the most important.

Make use of this time. It is more valuable to the up coming fishing season than you may think! Mark Williams

Do you buy on price or quality? The bottom line usually is the depth of one's wallet. However, I offer a bit of advice. If you buy the best you can afford, you can generally recover some money through resale when you decide to upgrade. If you buy cheap, there is no resale value or they break down under our harsh trolling conditions. This is especially true with rods and reels. Mark Williams

\$500 CONSERVATION SCHOLARSHIP

On behalf of your Board of Directors it gives me great pleasure to announce the formation of the Detroit Area Steelheaders Conservation Scholarship. Nearly a year ago the Board started the process of putting together a small scholarship award for some lucky high school student choosing to go into the field of conservation. Be it Conservation Officer, Wildlife Biology, Oceanography or any other career benefiting our beloved waters or woods, we now have an avenue to help out a budding conservationist.

After several re-writes to get the particular language to the entire BOD's satisfaction we now have a document that allows a high school senior to apply for and earn a \$500 scholarship to the college of their choice. There are several requirements, but let me take a moment to outline the major factors. First and foremost the candidate must be furthering his or her education in the conservation field. Secondly the applicant must be sponsored or recommended by a member of the Detroit Area Steelheaders. Third the applicant must complete and submit an application by the specified date to be considered for the scholarship.

As a conservation organization, DAS could not think of a better way to insure that our outdoor heritage remains intact than giving to a deserving student that plans to make his or her life ambition a career in conservation services. Our club has made many donations to

worthwhile causes over the years. In this Director's opinion, helping a young person start down the road to a lifetime of protecting and improving our Woods, Waters, Fields and Streams is as worthy a cause as any organization could ever hope to be a part of.
