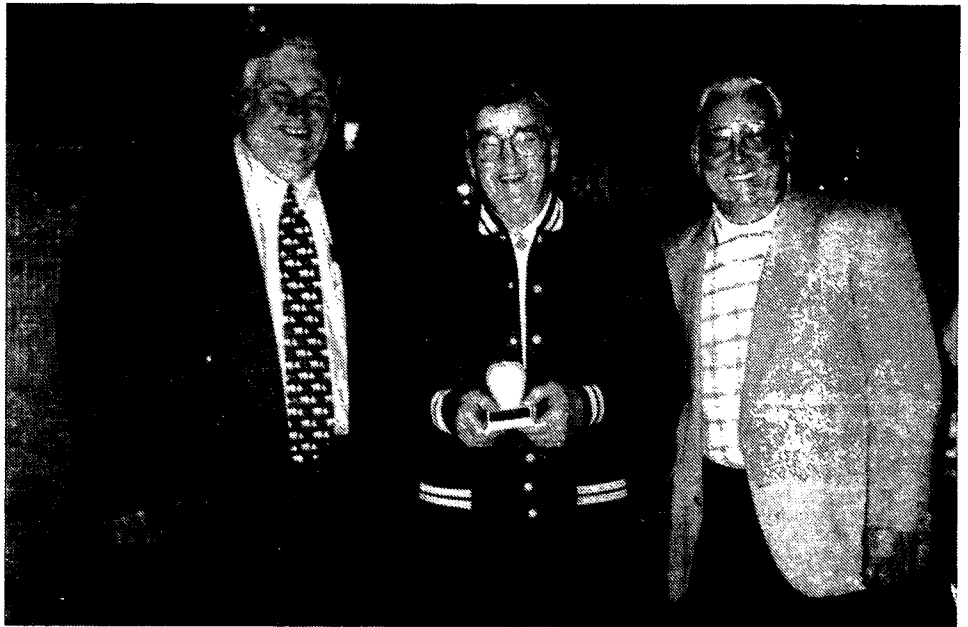
Detroit Area Steelheaders earn recognition

FELLOWS MARINA TO HOST LADIES DAY AT OSCODA

On Saturday, June 26, Detroit Area Steelheaders will travel to Oscoda for the annual Ladies Day tournament. The past few years, salmon have dominated the interest of Steelheaders, but skippers should remember that Lake Trout and Steelhead can be plentiful there at this time of year.

The tournament headquarters is again at Fellows Marina, and you can reserve a slip there by calling (517) 739-2525.

Ladies Day rules are simple: men can set lines, net fish, and drive the boat, but only women can handle the pole after hook-up.

As in years past, we ask that each crew bring a dish to pass at the potluck picnic which follows the weigh-in. A reminder: keep the perishables such as potato salad on ice while out on the lake. I don't want any of it to spoil, because I really love potato salad! Meat, pop and beer will be furnished.

The Saturday schedule begins with the Skippers' meeting at 5:00 a.m. at the Fellows Marina office. The tournament will get under way at 6:00 a.m. outside the mouth of the Au Sable River. There will be Fish Calls at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m., and we will all pull our lines at noon, to accommodate the 1:00 p.m. weigh-in. The potluck will start when the weigh-in is completed, or at 3:00 p.m. if fishing is cancelled.

The rain never showed, but the flies sure did. If you ever see a brown cloud on the water, don't let your curiosity get the best of you - don't investigate! That cloud probably is gnats ... they cover everything. Several boats had to quit fishing after passing through the cloud.

The second Fish Call showed most boats with fish and catching up, but 3 boats still didn't have any. At the weigh-in, 23 of 26 boats had a catch, with "My Treasure" first, "Last Dime III" second, and "Sloppy Joe" third.

Sunday saw the Team Doubles competition under way on time at 6:00 a.m. Again, most boats targeted Lake Trout, which were being caught bouncing bottom in 90'-120'. 'The Brat' finally broke out of his slump and caught tournament-specific fish, while the team of "Blue Star" and "Mary K" took first place to wrap up another great weekend at Port Austin!

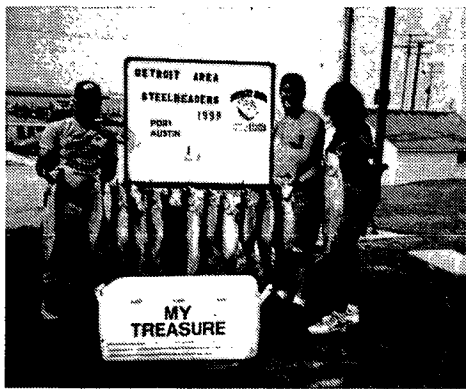

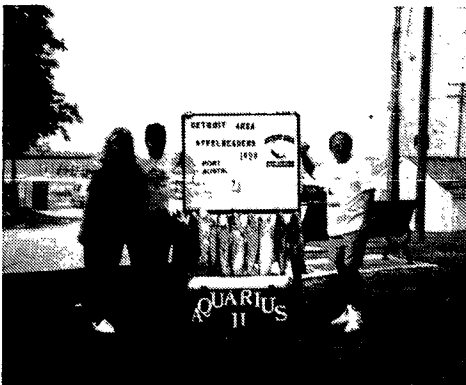

As we pulled lines, I was very excited to go to the weigh-in and picnic because a couple of boats which had not yet won a tournament had reported some good numbers of fish and I was eager to see who would come out on top.

As I cooked hot dogs and Polish sausages, Doug Karakas weighed in the catches, announcing the results in his loud voice: "Lake Trout, 5.06 pounds, King Salmon, 10.6 pounds

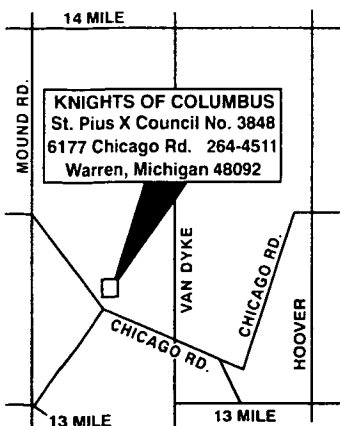
the bull and enjoying a nice spring sunset.
